Easy Grilled Corn With Chili Lime Butter

Spice up your side dishes with this zesty corn.

INGREDIENTS

- 4 tablespoons salted, light margarine, softened
- 1 teaspoon zested lime peel
- 1 tablespoon fresh lime juice
- 1 teaspoon chili powder
- 4 ears fresh corn, still in husk

DIRECTIONS

- Peel open the corn, leaving some husk attached. Strip silk from corn, then return husk to original position.
- 2. Preheat grill to medium heat.
- 3. Mix margarine, lime juice, zest and chili powder until well blended. Set aside.
- Grill corn for 20 minutes or until tender, turning every
 minutes with tongs so the entire cob is evenly grilled.
- 5. Cool briefly, then peel remaining husk.
- 6. Serve corn with chili lime butter.



ENT Enters the Picture

Having provided monthly ear, nose and throat (ENT) services at Monroe County Hospital & Clinics (MCHC) since last fall, Matthew Brown, MD, FACS, feels like part of our community.

Dr. Brown also treats children, mainly for ear infections and conditions of the tonsils. His pediatric services include placing ear tubes and removing tonsils and adenoids.

"I like meeting and helping people," Dr. Brown said. "I appreciate the diversity patients bring to health care. No two patients are the same."

Dr. Brown enjoys caring for patients in South Central Iowa and familiarizing himself with our region.

An Array of Advanced Practice

In 1965, the first nurse practitioner program in the U.S. was established at the University of Colorado. Almost 60 years later, the nurse practitioner field of medicine is thriving. On an annual basis, Americans visit nurse practitioners more than 1.06 billion times, according to the American Association of Nurse Practitioners.

As advanced practice providers, nurse practitioners can perform many of the same functions that physicians offer, including making diagnoses and prescribing medications. And like physicians, nurse practitioners may choose to specialize in many different areas of medicine, including:

- acute care
- family health
- gerontology health

- psychiatric/mental health

IT'S NEVER TOO early to start thinking about back-to-school. If your child needs an annual physical exam for school or athletic enrollment, MCHC is here to help. Did you know we also provide physicals for adults, including preemployment and Department of Transportation (DOT) physicals? If you schedule your visits today, you might be preventing problems down the road.

BACK-TO-SCHOOL AND SPORTS PHYSICALS

Many schools require proof that your child is up to date on required immunizations before classes begin. Sports teams may also require a physical to ensure your child is healthy enough to play or to document any prior injuries or limitations.

However, back-to-school physicals are a good idea for your children whether they're required or not. The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that all children between 3 and 21 get an annual wellness exam. (Kids under 3 need more frequent visits.) A pediatric wellness exam includes:

- checking your child's eyesight and hearing
- discussing issues that affect mental health
- making sure your child's medications are properly managed
- staying caught up on vaccines, including flu, HPV and meningitis
- talking about ways to stay safe on and off the field "An annual physical can help establish healthy behaviors that may prevent chronic disease down the road," said Kendra Sinclair, Director of Rural Health Clinic Operations at Monroe County Hospital & Clinics. "Changing unhealthy behaviors is much easier during childhood and adolescence than in adulthood."



Preventive health care can't always keep you from getting sick. However, it can help you stay healthier in the long term. As a result, you can effectively lower your healthcare costs.

An annual adult or child wellness visit will include needed health screenings and immunizations. Insurance plans are required to cover these visits at no cost, although you may owe small fees for lab tests. Check with your plan to find out what is covered.

DOT PHYSICALS

As a truck driver or bus driver, you are required to get a medical exam in order to obtain and keep your commercial license. MCHC offers DOT-compliant physicals with providers who are certified medical examiners by the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration. These comprehensive screenings include audiometry (hearing tests).

"With a DOT physical, you can start your trucking journey worry-free," Sinclair said. "We are committed to supporting your health and keeping you on the road for safe travel."

SPECIALIZING IN HAND and upper extremity care, Dr. Gainer didn't envision himself becoming a physician while growing up in southern Illinois. He majored in pharmacy in college, but a different career path presented itself when a friend needed his help.

"I'm from an athletic family—my father was a high school basketball coach—and I enjoy fixing things," Dr. Gainer said. "My

interest in hand surgery started in college. A close friend had a serious thumb injury, and I drove him 70 miles each way to see a hand surgeon."

POINTING PATIENTS TOWARD HEALING

Dr. Gainer attended medical school and performed his residency at Southern Illinois University before completing a fellowship at the University of Pittsburgh. In practice for 23 years and on staff at Des Moines-based Iowa Ortho, Dr. Gainer sees patients at Monroe County Hospital & Clinics' Susan Allison Outpatient Clinic twice per month.

"I like getting out of the Des Moines metro area and coming to South Central Iowa," he said. "It's a nice break from a hectic schedule." At our Outpatient Clinic, Dr. Gainer treats adults and teenagers for a variety of hand and upper extremity conditions, including:

- carpal tunnel syndrome

- De Quervain's tenosynovitis
- Dupuytren's contracture
- fractures
- ganglion cysts
- thumb arthritis
- trigger finger
- work-related injuries

No matter the situation, Dr. Gainer views his role as a partnership with patients. Together, they decide on the most appropriate form of treatment.

"I provide comprehensive elbow-to-hand care for a wide variety of diagnoses," he said. "I include patients in the decision-making process without telling them what to do."

Spotlight on Women's Health

Kendra Martin, DO, offers comprehensive women's health care close to home.

"We offer a wide variety of services locally," said Kendra Martin, DO, dually board-certified family and neuromusculoskeletal physician at Monroe County Hospital & Clinics.

"We provide high-quality care so patients don't have to travel long distances."

PRIORITIZING PREVENTIVE CARE

At MCHC, we offer a range of preventive care services, including:

- pelvic exams and Pap tests to screen for cervical cancer
- breast exams and 3D mammography
- immunizations
- DEXA bone density scans for osteoporosis diagnosis

CONVENIENT TREATMENTS AND PROCEDURES

In addition to preventive care, we also offer treatments for many conditions, including sexually transmitted diseases, vaginitis,

urinary tract infections, pelvic floor pain, heavy or irregular periods, and menopause symptoms.

For your convenience, Dr. Martin performs several gynecological procedures in-office. These include:

- Colposcopy: This procedure is done when a Pap test shows abnormal cervical cells. Your doctor examines the cervix with a magnifying device called a colposcope. In some cases, a biopsy may be done at the same time, which means the doctor will remove a small piece of tissue from the cervix, vagina or vulva.
- Endometrial biopsy: In this procedure, your doctor removes a small amount of tissue from the endometrium, the lining of the uterus. This may be done if you have post-menopausal bleeding or abnormal periods.
- Birth control procedures: These include intrauterine devices (IUDs), which are small T-shaped devices made of plastic, roughly about the size of a quarter. The doctor implants an IUD inside the uterus. We also offer Nexplanon, a birth control implant that is placed under the skin of the upper arm, where it releases a hormone to prevent pregnancy.

- Breast cancer: Begin regular continue as long as you are in good health and expect to live
- Cervical cancer: Get your first Pap test at age 25 and continue with routine

Women who are at high risk of developing breast or cervical cancer, due to hereditary or other factors, may need to begin screening
