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## Is It Time for a Mammogram?

Screening for breast cancer can save your life.

**IF YOU HAVE** undiagnosed breast cancer, you may not have any noticeable symptoms. That's why mammograms are so critical. Mammograms can detect tiny tumors in your breasts years before you can feel a lump.

"Finding breast cancer in the earliest stages is the best scenario," said Jenny Klyn, MHA, RT(R)(M)(ARRT) (RDMS), Director of Ancillary Services/Radiology Manager/Outpatient Clinic & Infusion Center Manager at Monroe County Hospital & Clinics. "When breast cancer is found before it spreads to other parts of the body, treatment may be easier for the patient and is more likely to be successful."

#### MCHC MAKES MAMMOGRAMS EASY

Women 40 and older need annual screening mammograms, and women at high risk of breast cancer may want to start sooner.

"MCHC offers 3D mammography, the gold standard for breast cancer detection," Klyn said. "With 3D mammograms, radiologists can see tumors even in dense breast tissue."

Dense breast tissue makes it harder to detect tumors. Younger women are more likely to have dense breasts.

"It is very important for women to know if their breasts are dense," Klyn said. "At MCHC, we help educate patients on their breast density so they can be informed."

The mammography program at MCHC is certified by the American College of Radiology, which represents the highest level of image quality and safety.

## THE SEASON FO

If you've already met your insurance deductible, now is a great time to schedule elective procedures.

**FALL IS THE TIME** for watching football, wearing cozy sweaters and enjoying pumpkin spice everything. It's also a great time to schedule any elective medical procedures you or your family might need.

"It is never too early to start thinking about the end of the year and where you are in terms of your healthcare spending," said Michele Manternach, BSN, RN, CNOR, Surgery Manager at Monroe

County Hospital & Clinics. "If you have met or are close to meeting your deductible, the end of the year is a perfect time to get medical procedures, possibly at little to no cost."

#### WHAT ARE ELECTIVE PROCEDURES?

An emergency procedure is a surgery that needs to take place immediately, such as after a car accident or a cancer diagnosis. An elective procedure, on the other hand, is any type of surgery or other medical procedure that is not urgent. Elective procedures may be truly optional, such as a cosmetic procedure to appear younger, but many elective procedures are recommended by your providers for a serious medical reason. Common elective procedures include:

- Bunion or hammertoe treatment
- Carpal tunnel release
- Cataract removal surgery
- Cyst and lipoma removal
- Hernia repair
- Joint replacement
- Weight-loss surgery

In general, elective procedures can improve both your health and your overall quality of life.

"Many people put off elective procedures because they are worried about the expense and the issue isn't an emergency," Manternach said. "But anytime a patient postpones a recommended surgery, there is a risk of the condition becoming worse and causing complications that can make the surgery more difficult."

#### WHY DO IT NOW?

If you haven't made your health a priority lately, now is a great time to do it. If you're close to meeting your deductible, the procedure you need could cost just a few thousand dollars instead of much more. If you're close to or have met your out-ofpocket maximum, your procedure could be just a few hundred dollars or potentially even cost-free.

MCHC can help you figure out your estimated cost for procedures, based on your plan and current spending.

"MCHC has a great team of professionals, including a financial counselor, who helps patients navigate what is covered and

what might not be," Manternach said. "I encourage everyone to understand what is covered and what is not covered so there will be no unexpected bills."

Another benefit of surgery before your deductible resets in January: Fall can be a great time to recover. Cooler weather means heavier clothes, so it's easier to conceal scars and bandages. Many people also already take off time around the holidays, which may make it easier for you to get the help you need after surgery.

### What's the Deal With Deductibles?

Unfortunately, your monthly health insurance payment doesn't cover most of your medical costs. If you or a family member needs an elective procedure, here are some terms to understand so you can better understand the costs:

- Deductible: This is the amount you have to pay before your insurance kicks in. If you have a standard insurance plan, your deductible may be a few hundred dollars. If you have a high-deductible health plan, it might be several thousand. If you have not met your deductible, all health costs are generally out of pocket, except for preventive care.
- Copayment: Some plans have set copayments, where you always pay a fixed amount for certain medications or doctors' visits.
- Coinsurance: Once you meet your deductible, your insurance will start covering a certain percentage of costs for in-network providers, according to the terms of your plan. This means that you may now only owe 20% or 30% of the cost of doctors' appointments and medications, while your insurance pays the rest.
- Out-of-pocket maximum: This is the most you will have to pay for medical expenses in one plan year. Once you reach this figure, your insurance should cover all expenses for in-network providers at no cost to you. Your out-of-pocket maximum includes what you spend on deductibles, copays and coinsurance, but not your monthly payments.
- Out-of-network: You may have a separate and higher deductible for out-of-network costs, along with a higher out-of-pocket maximum.
   Some plans do not cover any out-ofnetwork costs.



The team consists of dedicated oncology nurses in the clinic and infusion center.





more oncological services close to home. Since patients can stay here for treatment, they can avoid the stress and financial strain of traveling for care.

"Limiting stress can help a patient to heal physically and mentally," Klyn said. "It is very rewarding to help these patients get care close to home."

Dr. Schultheis and his team are in constant contact with MCHC clinic and infusion center nurses, even when they are not on-site.

#### LEADING-EDGE COMFORT AND CARE

MCHC provides diagnostic imaging and testing, with a wide range of laboratory services and advanced imaging, including:

- 3D mammography
- PET scans

• CT scans

• Ultrasound

• MRI

While MCHC does not offer radiation therapy, and oncologic surgery is limited to certain procedures, patients can get chemotherapy and other infusions on-site.

"As a smaller facility, we are not always able to offer all of the services some patients need, but we will help coordinate care with other medical facilities," Klyn said. "However, we have two general surgeons who perform port insertions for chemotherapy, and our stateof-the-art infusion center has two nurses who provide chemotherapy full-time."

The infusion center has semi-private and private spaces for patients and their families. MCHC staff endeavors to provide comfort to patients during what is often an uncomfortable process. In addition to televisions and reading material, the center offers snacks, meals, blankets, pillows and other personal touches to help patients feel at home.

#### PERSONALIZED TREATMENT MAKES A DIFFERENCE

Receiving care locally offers benefits that go beyond accessibility. For one, MCHC is very patient-focused, with care personalized to each patient.

"I feel our staff really cares about our patients, and we try to get to know them so we know how best to help them," Klyn said. "We look at all of the needs of a patient to ensure the best care. For instance, if a patient has transportation issues, we try to schedule as many appointments as we can on the same day."

Many MCHC staff were raised in the area and choose to stay here to provide care to their friends and neighbors in the community. But non-local providers feel the same way.

"Dr. Schultheis truly cares about his patients and their families," Klyn said. "He spends so much time getting to know them and their needs."

Lung cancer is the second most common cancer in both men and women in the U.S. Early detection and new therapeutic options have made the disease much more treatable than it once was. Screenings are the best way to detect lung cancer early.

Annual low-dose CT scans to screen for lung cancer are now recommended for most current and former smokers ages 50 t0 80. You should ask your provider about screenings if you have no current symptoms and:

- you are between 50 and 80
- you still smoke or have quit within the past 15 years
- you have a 20-pack year smoking history (i.e., you smoked one pack of cigarettes daily for 20 years, two packs daily for 10 years, etc.)
