WHAT IS A PRIMARY CARE PRACTICE?

Primary care promotes effective communication with patients and encourages the role of the patient as a partner in health care. Your primary care physician or nurse practitioner is your medical 'home'.

A primary care practice serves as the patient's first point of entry into the health care system. Primary care practices provide patients with ready access to their own personal physician or family nurse practitioner.

Within a primary care practice, the physicians and nurse practitioners work together in meeting you and your family's health care needs.

Primary care includes diagnosis and treatment of acute and chronic illnesses, health promotion, disease prevention, health maintenance, counseling and patient education.

WHAT IS A PRIMARY CARE PROVIDER (PCP)?

A primary care provider (PCP) is the first line of defense for you and your family's health care needs. Family physicians and family nurse practitioners can provide the medical care you need and offer recommendations to protect your health. Over time, your physician or nurse practitioner will get to know you, which leads to better medical care by catching small health problems before they become serious. A PCP will learn your history and your family history and will recommend a specialist when needed.

Selecting a primary care physician or nurse practitioner is an important first step toward managing your healthcare. They are the person you speak to about your health questions and concerns.

When choosing a PCP, consider what is most important to you:

- area of expertise
- personality traits you appreciate
- experience
- philosophy of care
- languages spoken
